

Two-Day Seminar

To commemorate the **150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi**, this year, we will be organizing a two-day seminar on Gandhi. The seminar will consist of different panels and eminent speakers who will be invited to share their views and insights on the legacy of this great personage. These will be interspersed with interactive sessions and discussion workshops. Through this seminar, we will be reflecting on Gandhi's vision and technique of conflict resolution. He evolved **satyagraha** as the most pragmatic and potent technique of conflict resolution and as the morally correct way of life, based on the dialectics of 'conversion' through which alone can Truth, human life's ultimate mission, be approached.
