'Empowerment of Underprivileged Women through Legal Awareness, Counselling, Aid & Training in Beauty **Culture & Forming SHGs.'**


Under the PTI Project, Shanti Sahyog continues to help women living in our catchment area of 17 South Delhi slums, make the transition from being, 'DOMESTIC VIOLENCE VICTIMS (DVV's)', to, 'EMPOWERED DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SURVIVORS.' The above is evident in the increased number of DVVs seeking help from our Centre. From 1 January to 30 June 2024, our Outreach Workers mobilised 3077 women and organised 26 Legal Awareness Camps attended by 705 beneficiaries. 30 women were provided a livelihood, while 70 Registered cases and 42 Identified cases of domestic violence were reported and counseled. Adv Swati Saxena held sessions on various topics at our Centre, to make women aware of their rights and empower them to stand up against social injustice:



15 Feb 2024 **Financial Literacy cum Awareness** Camp at Kalkaji Community Centre

The above Camp, attended by 35 beneficiaries and organised in collaboration with MSME Trust, marked a significant milestone in our efforts to promote entrepreneurship and economic empowerment. Leveraging the support and expertise of MSME Trust, we facilitated the registration of five entities under the MSME scheme during the camp and provided them with certificates. The camp

symbolises our commitment to promoting financial literacy, gender equality, and economic development at the grassroots level.



24 Jan 2024 Cancer Camp for Women in collaboration with Raiiv Gandhi Cancer Institute. 134 women were screened for breast & cervical cancer.

Tughlakabad Village Implements WAPCOS Project

Providing Health (Physical/Mental) Services & Nutrition to Underprivileged Women

List of Weekly OPDs held from 1 Jan to 30 June 2024







Under the WAPCOS Project, from January 1 to June 30, 2024, **24 OPDs** were held in various TKD Village communities, **benefiting 1,359 women**. During these camps, free medicines were given. Sanitary napkins hand wash, and other essentials were also distributed to the beneficiaries. **6 Nutrition Camps** were held, **attended by 149 women**, to teach about the importance of a nutritious and healthy diet.

27-04-2024 Free Mega Health Camp, Community Centre, Kalkaji

The goal of the Camp was to promote general health awareness, encourage preventive healthcare practices and provide an opportunity for early detection of health issues. The facilities included checking of blood pressure, blood sugar level testing, eye and dental checkups, mammography and pap smear tests. A general physician and a gynaecologist were available for consultation. The Camp was well attended and received positive feedback from the beneficiaries.



Self-Help Groups (SHGs) PTI Projects Jan to June 2024

SHGs are essential for women's empowerment, promoting economic independence and self-confidence through savings, microfinance, and skill development. Shanti Sahyog has successfully established 14 new SHGs. During this period, our team members **Priyanka**, **Saroj Lata**, **and Saba Khan participated in capacity-building sessions with Sh. Yashwant Rawat, Community Organizer, Divisional Magistrate Office of South East District, Delhi.** He provided valuable guidance and introduced us to the **Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihoods Mission.** With departmental support, our SHG activities are now effectively supervised, enhancing their impact. We are committed to empowering women and fostering meaningful community contributions.

23 March 2024 Saas Bahu Sammelan & Basant Utsav




